Willie Young was born in Girvan, Ayrshire, He is the Chairman of Brechin Tindal Oatts - a leading Scottish legal firm and currently on the UEFA referee observers' panel. Willie was a top class football referee for 15 seasons, during which time he referee-ed over 500 Scottish senior matches. Before age defeated him, Willie was on the FIFA list of international referees and officiated in 27 different countries at a total of 71 European and world matches, including as 4th official at the 1999 UEFA Cup Final.
